Prevention and Control of Head Lice

Head lice are a persistent nuisance in schools

The leaflet attached to this newsletter explains how to check your child's hair and the importance of doing this every week. It explains the options available for treatment if you find your child does have head lice. Head lice are not a health hazard because they do not carry serious diseases.

It is **not** County Council policy that pupils with head lice are sent home from school or to send letters to parents whenever a case is discovered or reported in a school.

To help prevent the spread of head lice:

- * Comb your child's hair regularly with a nit or bug-busting comb. You can buy these from your local pharmacist;
- * Periodically inspect the hair of all the children in the family;
- * Do not be embarrassed to tell the parents of any other children who may have had head-to-head contact with your child.
- * Thank other parents if they let you know that their child has lice.
