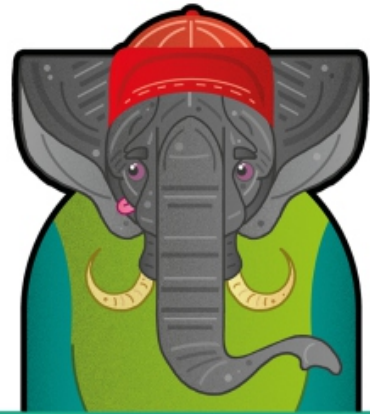
Yoimoji of the Week: Ferris
